About the Seminar

Context

Social and economic planning in any form is a function of rigorous Social Science Research through production, dissemination and utilisation of knowledge, which enables a robust understanding of the society, culture, polity and the economy and creates pointers to devise public policy to attain sustainable development. The main components of the framework for strengthening policy-relevant social science research are governance, politics, societies, and economy. There are many players such as higher educational institutions, research institutions, think tanks and government funding agencies that shape the landscape of Social Science Research in India. Government agencies such as Niti Ayog, NSSO, NFHS, Census provide data and policy inputs for the country's socio-economic development, crucial for social science research. The role of global institutions is also significant in its development. The contribution of Social Science Research to policy-making is both substantial and indispensable, serving as a critical tool for identifying key indicators and pathways necessary for achieving developmental goals from time to time.

Social science research in India

The landscape of social science institutions has evolved over time beginning with state university system and diversified into central universities, social science research institutions under the ICSSR, institutions of national importance, private universities and private consultancy firms involved in social science research. The academic resources vary across the type of institutions - while the Central Universities, IITs, NITs, or IIMs and research institutions are well resourced, the state universities and colleges under governments are under resourced. The quality of social science education and research also varies with the diversity of institutions. A large number of researchers are based in underdeveloped or remote regions, often with limited access to institutional support, infrastructure, and mentorship. This disparity has led to an evident divide in both research output and participation in academic discourse. In the current academic scenario, it is increasingly important to understand and address the challenges faced by social science researchers, working in various types of institutions.

Challenges faced by Social Science Research

The epistemic challenges of social sciences are many- social science research is shaped by colonial and eurocentric frameworks, there is tension between universal theories and local contexts; fragmentation of social sciences, epistemic silos and inadequate application of interdisciplinarity; vernacular epistemologies remain less explored and so on.

Despite the material and intellectual investment made at all levels to achieve a robust research environment in India, there are structural and operational challenges while undertaking Social Science Research - inadequate funding, less utilization of research output into policy making, brain-drain, dependence on donor agencies resulting in misalignment of research priorities from local concerns, less visibility, less human resources in the educational institutions and low quality of research to name a few. Having a large higher education system, the priority towards social sciences is less compared to other sciences in terms of funding and infrastructural support. Though these issues were identified as crucial over a period of time, the wide- ranging interlinkages between the issues related to Social Science Research were not critically analysed in recent times.

Objective of the Seminar

Researchers at the Centre for Economic and Social Studies, Council for Social development and BITS Pilani Hyderabad campus, are involved in a research project 'Doing Research Assessment' 'research on research' assessing social science research in India with the support of ICSSR and Global Development Network. In a bid to explore further the new ideas on social sciences research and the issues and challenges faced by it in the country, CESS is organizing a two-day International-level seminar on the Social Science Research in India. The main objective of this International seminar is to serve as a platform for dialogue among scholars, policy makers, practitioners, and research administrators in India to exchange experiences, examine the impediments, and chart actionable pointers for strengthening the Social Science Research ecosystem in India. The main aim of the seminar is to engage with the following key questions:

- How is Social Science Research perceived in contemporary India, particularly in the context of changing academic, policy, and funding landscapes?
- What institutional interventions and initiatives have been undertaken to promote and mainstream Social Science Research in India?
- What are the priority areas for enhancing the quality and impact of Social Science Research? In which domains should researchers focus more to strengthen their academic competencies?
- Are there sustained and structured mechanisms in place for capacity-building and professional development of Social Science Research?
- In what ways is Social Science Research informing and influencing policy formulation and implementation in India?
